## Our Program

Our comprehensive program includes a structured environment with a high degree of accountability. Our trained staff and counselors offer care, love, and understanding as we help our students reach their potential through Christ. Students participate in volunteer activities, Bible study, worship, counseling, Celebrate Recovery, and 12-step programs.



## Our Story – House of Hope

In 1984, Youth Challenge International (YCI) purchased 28 acres in Wildwood to offer a rehabilitation program for men. YCI remained on the campus until 2014 when they moved their program back to Connecticut. Hope Lutheran church purchased the property and allowed the newly formed ministry of House of Hope to provide our program on that same campus.

When the property was sold in 2019, the students moved to a temporary location offered by Wildwood United Methodist church and remained in the program there until that property was sold in 2023.

At the same time, the ministry received a grant allowing House of Hope to purchase land in Wildwood for a new, permanent campus which will be built on 5.5 acres near Hwy. 301 and CR 462. **Our students, staff, and Board are excited about the next steps for the ministry and we invite you to join us on this journey.**
