"God Showed Me What To Do!"



Samuel's parents were teens. Two weeks before he was born his dad was sent to prison.

I was raised by my grandmother on Long Island but, when I was 13, my grandmother died and my mother stepped in. My mother was in an abusive relationship so at 16 I lived with another family until I graduated from high school.

At 17 I began using recreational drugs and started drinking. By 21, I was using hard drugs. At 22, I was arrested for possession of heroin and spent 6 months in jail.

When I was released, I moved to Florida to live with my mom. I started getting into trouble again. I spent 5 months at a rehab center. That is where I began to know Jesus as my savior.

When I left rehab, I got a job at Publix. I was offered a job as a new car salesman. The job was great, but I found myself slipping up and falling back into the same patterns. Within a few months I lost everything. I spoke with my pastor and he suggested House of Hope but I wasn't ready. One day I was sitting on the porch talking to the Lord, asking him to give me a sign so I would know what to do. I looked up to see my pastor. He asked if I was ready and I said "Yes." He drove me to House of Hope.


Merry Christmas from the **House of Hope!**

I spent 6 months at House of Hope. It was a different atmosphere. I began to see that people cared about me. They treated me with dignity. The volunteers and community members were encouraging and that encouragement came from their hearts. I began to reflect more on my situation. I had blamed others in the past – nothing was ever my fault.

I remember a specific session with a counselor where I shared and she listened. She was empathetic and she said I was the problem and needed to make changes. That session opened my eyes and I felt a sense of peace. The Lord showed me what I had to do.

Today, I am living with a wonderful couple in The Villages. I look at them as role models and they are like my parents. I have gone back to work at the car dealership and have been able to pay off my credit cards and am now saving for a small home.

Life is good! As I look at my goals, a very important one is giving back to House of Hope with my time as a volunteer and, when able, financially because I know they supported me when I had nothing.

House of Hope was there for Samuel when he needed us because of your support!
